In addition, NEAS Quality Principles augment these by providing a number of tasks to be undertaken by this pivotal Senior Leadership team member. These guidance notes set out core accountabilities to assist providers in understanding the nature of the academic leadership required. Please also find enclosed a sample Academic Manager Job Description and details of the NEAS Endorsed Academic Manager Professional Development Program.

	•	Verify teachers' qualifications.
Important Considerations	•	Any teaching load undertaken by the academic leader must take into consideration the core accountabilities above. Other tasks are allotted according to the Organisation Structure of the provider.
	•	Given the diverse nature of providers of ELICOS programs, there is some flexibility in the way the academic leadership is organised. The role may be labelled in a different manner internally, however, an academic manager should oversee and/or coordinate the key tasks which require academic oversight.

Purpose	• This concept paper outlines the NEAS Endorsed Academic Manager Professional Development (PD) program, and includes the initiative's
Rationale	 rationale, structure, entry requirements, and fees. NEAS has identified a need to articulate an integrated PD program that is purpose designed to support NEAS Members in developing select ELT practitioners to assume senior management accountabilities as Academic Managers and Centre Directors.
 Program Structure Needs analysis In-person or virtual Management Workshops 	 The program is segmented into two sections consisting of the following: Needs analysis NEAS requests the Centre to provide structured information on its current PD program. As part of the needs analysis, an in-person or virtual one-hour Management Meeting is also held. Output: A needs analysis report is developed for the Centre. Two x two-hour Management Workshops These consist of live engagements, held in-person or virtually, on two separate occasions, approximately one week apart.
 Entry requirements and fees Choice of two routes: Master Practitioner; or RPL. Note: GST is added to the listed costs. Important: This cost model only applies for up to 3 trainees. A customised quote is provided to larger groups. 	 There are two entry pathways to the NEAS Endorsed Academic Manager PD Program: NEAS Master Practitioner Completion of seven Core Courses (free). Completion of one (of six) Specialisation Courses (\$19). Completion of Master Practitioner in ELT Capstone Course (\$299). Total = \$318. Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) Evidence of 440 hours of English language teaching, which is equivalent to 44 CPD points. An Assessment of Qualifications is conducted by NEAS, reviewing the applicant's qualifications and work experience. Output: A Letter of Assessment is finalised. Total = \$250. Other fees Needs analysis = \$340. First two-hour Management Workshop = \$680. Second two-hour Management Workshop = \$680. Total other fees = \$1700.
Outcome	 Participants successfully completing the Academic Manager PD program are awarded the NEAS Endorsed Academic Manager designation. Awardees are announced in NEAS media channels and at the next NEAS Management Conference.
